Synesthesia has been described by some as a rare neurological condition where stimulation of one sensory modality evokes perceptual experiences in another, while others have called it an unique "sixth sense."

In addition to presentations by psychologists, neuroscientists, artist and art historians conducting research on synesthesia, the conference will feature presentations by individuals with synesthesia. They will discuss how this fascinating phenomenon informs their work in various fields including art and photography.
